UNDERSTANDING SUDDEN VISION LOSS OR CHANGES



• Experiencing sudden vision loss, which could range from partial to total blindness, or sudden changes in vision such as blurriness, blind spots, or visual disturbances like seeing flashes of light.

WHAT IT MIGHT INDICATE

- Urgent condition: Sudden vision loss or changes can indicate several serious conditions, including retinal detachment, stroke affecting the visual pathways of the brain, or central retinal artery occlusion.
- Other causes might include optic neuritis, macular degeneration, severe glaucoma, or a retinal migraine.
- Please note: Sudden vision change is a medical emergency. **Immediate** intervention can be crucial for the best chance of restoring vision.

IMMEDIATE ACTIONS

- If you experience sudden vision loss or changes, seek immediate medical attention. Do not wait to see if your vision improves.
- · Avoid driving; seek assistance from someone else.
- Do not rub or apply pressure to your eyes.
